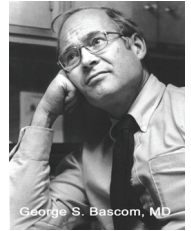

Dr. Reid received her Ph.D. in zoology from Howard University in 1986. Since 1980, she has been at American Type Culture Collection (ATCC), a private, nonprofit biological resource center and research organization whose mission is to maintain and provide standard reference microorganisms, cell lines and other materials for research in the life sciences. She studied DNA-based approaches to identifying human cell lines, which led to the routine screening of all such lines at ATCC and other cell banks. Reid co-chaired an ATCC committee on the Development of a Consensus Standard for the Authentication of Human Cell Lines.
