# **Endowed Assistant** Professorship in Cancer Research

The multidisciplinary approach to cancer research increases the potential for new discoveries. The goal of this new program is to increase the number of faculty members doing cancer research in every research department at K-State.

This program will provide the first three years' salary for a *newly hired* tenure-track assistant professor performing cancer research. It encourages departments to recruit cancer scientists in anticipation of an open faculty line. The department head/dean will provide lab space, start-up expenses, and salary for the remainder of the tenure-earning period.

The center plans to establish new endowments to make it possible to fund several positions each year.
